The racquetball is served by the last person in line. It hits the floor, the wall, and the game has begun. It's a war, a battle. Sometimes a powerful smack sends the next opponent into a temporary panic. Sometimes a little drop shot makes players gallop to the wall. The Model United Nations conference is more than just something that looks good on a college application; it is a way for a diverse group of people to come together and become involved in a heated debate in order to have an enjoyable time and voice the opinions of their country.

What does the *real* United Nations do?

Model United Nations is a student-run organization that is based on the United Nations, a peacekeeping association dedicated to world affairs. However, the Model UN deviates slightly from the real UN.

Officers of the Model United Nations subcommittees create their own topics for delegates to discuss. The real UN is dealing with very serious global issues that some delegates believe should have been discussed instead.

"I think we should discuss them because these are real, serious issues that need to be dealt with," stated Brandon Cunningham '08.

Perhaps the biggest issue at the United Nations as for 2008 is the ongoing genocide in Darfur. On Jan. 8, Sudanese Armed Forces attacked a United Nations convoy carrying rations for UNAMID (United Nations, African Mission in Darfur) personnel. There were no causalities, but Secretary-General Ban Ki-Moon

strongly condemns the attacks and believes the government of Sudan must cooperate for peace.

The Security Council of the United Nations is responsible for maintaining global security and international peacekeeping.

Recently the Security Council also expressed their concerns about Darfur and the surrounding countries. According to the UN website, Council members asked Sudan and Chad "to exercise restraint and pursue dialogue and cooperation" and respect their commitments to the United Nations.

In addition to respecting the United Nations, the Office of the UN High Commissioner for Refugees is attempting to respect the rights of countries where Iraqi refugees fled. They are appealing for more than \$260 million dollars to help countries with a sudden influx of displaced refugees and to provide more educational and health services.

"It's good because it's supporting cooperation between countries and it's really

important during this time in the world," said Jamie Piotrowicz '08.

The "Big Five" composed of the United States, United Kingdom, France, Russian Federation, and China, were chosen back in the post-WWII era and given permanent seats in the Security Council because of their victories. The "Group of Four" nations, Germany, Japan, Brazil, and India have made demands for permanent seats as well. Each of the four countries has contributed to the UN. The resolution regarding this topic is awaiting approval from the United Nations General Assembly, which requires two-thirds majority to pass.

The United Nations and the Model United Nations may differ on some of the issues covered, but both organizations realize the world needs to use diplomacy to get their points across. Perhaps in the future, the Model UN will be more focused on what is really going on in the world and strive to help the UN fix it.



A referendum will be held on March 11, 2008 at WTHS from 12 p.m. to 9 p.m. to vote for a new proposal made in the Washington Township district that could save the high school hundreds of thousands of dollars as well as make the school more eco-friendly. The district is looking into using solar panels to power the high school. As the cost of energy continues to rise, adding solar panels to the roof of the high school can potentially lower the school's bill by nearly

30%. Not only will these panels cut costs, but they will help out the environment by reducing carbon dioxide emissions, which is the leading cause of global warming, and other environmental problems. This approach would also increase the value of the building. The initiation of this effective project will be determined by the vote of the taxpayers of the district. "All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and the State wherein they reside." The previous phrase, from the idol Jamie Lynn Spears is unnerving 14th Amendment, has begun a war in America. An amendment that was once just, is now a major fault in our constitution that I believe must be changed.

In 1868, the U.S. was dealing with the issue of African-American citizenship. The 14th Amendment was ratified in order to keep state governments from denying African-Americans citizenship to our country and to promote westward expansion. At the time of its ratification, the U.S. had no immigration policy and therefore had no illegal aliens. Today we have estimates of as high as 20 million illegal aliens resideing in our country.

In our society, this amendment means that illegal aliens may birth a child in our country and that child will become a citizen of the U.S. These children, once France, birthright citizenship has ended and 16 to 22 18, may sponsor their parents into citizenship.

Most illegal aliens have no health insurance.
